



Law Enforcement Fact Sheet

Overview

Since opening the doors to its new facility, HAMMER main campus props—including a Search & Rescue Building, six-story Training Tower, Tactical Maze Building and Port of Entry Prop— have been used frequently by law enforcement and security personnel. In 1998 HAMMER began offering an adjacent 10,000-acre law enforcement campus to federal, state and local law enforcement and security personnel. Through its partnership with the Hanford Patrol, Hanford's protective force, HAMMER meets a wide variety of armed and unarmed personnel training needs. HAMMER customers bring their own trainers or use the facility's cadre of highly qualified training professionals. Certified trainers include armorers with experience in firearms maintenance and munitions management, physical fitness trainers attuned to the special needs of law enforcement personnel, and range officers with a "safety first" approach.
